

# CLE224 COORDINATOR'S COMMENTS

The logs were remarkably error-free. Out of the total of over 1,750 loggings supplied, Joachim only needed to make changes to 6 reports - and two of those were duplicates to be deleted.

Could we remind reporters again to **please include the word FINAL** in your last CLE log, even if you don't send any interim ones. 10 of the logs didn't do that this time. It is a great help to Joachim and me, allowing us to recognise quickly the logs that are needed for the combined results. If you are really keen to help us(!), could I mention some other things that would also help:

Mentioning **your place name (your town, etc.)** in your final log each time is immediately recognised by us as 'the same as usual for you', saving us from looking in detail through the log to make sure it is from 'you' (some listeners don't give their surname) and in case you have moved QTH, if only just for that CLE or a short distance. Using just 'Home' or 'Location 1', etc., also needs some researching by us.

Including your **logs count** is welcome, especially for big logs, because our harvester programs also count what they have found and we can follow up with you if several of your reports seem to have gone missing.

Being really fussy now – I always find **double-spaced** log lines hard to work with (twice as many screen-fulls to check, for a start!). There – I bet I've provoked everyone to send double-spaced logs next time!!!
