

CLE325 COORDINATOR'S COMMENTS:

Hello all

For our **325th** Coordinated Listening Event, we were trying to log up to 8 NDBs in as many Locator Fields as possible in the frequency range **190 – 1740 kHz**. This was only our fourth “Fields” challenge. The last one before this took place 16 months ago during CLE309.

Most participants reported that at least on Friday night and Saturday morning, conditions were apparently quite good, so hopefully everyone had fun during this event. The following table shows how many different signals and countries have been logged by reporters from Europe and North America during CLE325. Some of these signals had not been heard for several months!

This gives a total of **760** different signals in **72** different Locator Fields from **124** countries including Africa, Asia, Caribbean, Europe, International Waters, North America, South America and Oceania! The following tables show the 15 fields with the most logged signals:
